

**MLearning 2.0** uses icons to differentiate between learning opportunities. An explanation of each Icon is below.

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### The ILT Icon



The **ILT Icon** identifies an **Instructor Led Training (ILT)** learning activity. An **ILT** is a classroom offering (session) associated with a **Course** (identified by the **Course Icon**).

When you see the **Teacher Icon**, look for a date, time and location.

- An **ILT** occurs in a classroom setting with an instructor and other learners.
  - **ILTs** can have multiple offerings – different dates, times and locations.
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### The Learning Module Icon



The **Learning Module Icon** identifies a Web-Based Training (WBT) learning activity called a **Learning Module**. A **Learning Module** is an online offering.

- When you see this icon, click the green **Register** or **Launch** button to begin.
  - Tests (Assessments) are also set up as **Learning Modules** so this icon indicates either a **Learning Module** or an online test.
  - eLearning activities are WBTs.
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### The Course Icon



The **Course Icon** identifies the title of a **Course** and the **Course Title** identifies the associated learning activity. Click the **Course Title** for more specific information such as the description, requirements, competencies and length or to find an offering for enrollment (when available for self enrolling).

- To enroll into the **Course** associated ILT, or launch the **Learning Module**, locate the associated Course offering.
  - See **The ILT Icon** and the **Learning Module Icon** above, for further information.
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### The Certification Icon



The **Certification Icon** identifies a **Certification**. A Certification is either a single Learning Activity that expires or multiple learning activities bundled together to fulfill a single requirement. The **Certification** is “Acquired” after completion of all **required** activities.

- When you see this icon, click on the Certification Title to view required learning activities and to launch associated Learning Modules.
  - All mandatories are Certifications. Most mandatories are a single learning activity, but they are placed in certifications because they expire and have due dates.
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
